During the year the contributions offered by the Fredericton Branch for the Mission on the Tobique (one hundred dollars annually for five years) has been accepted, and much interest is felt by the members in this new work of our Church.

The income of the Fredericton branch for the year is two hundred and sixty-eight dollars and five cents (\$268.05). The grants are as follows:

The Girl's Branch, Fredericton, has twenty-five members under Mrs. John Black as Vice-President. During the year the sum of \$40 has been accumulated.

The branch of the Association in St. Paul's Parish (St. John), has now sixty-five members. The receipts for the year amount to \$277, including members fees, donations, and the proceeds of the Annual Sale of needlework. The sum of \$50 has been devoted to the purchase of a carpet for the chancel of St. Paul's Church, and \$100 has been given towards the New Church at Doaktown. The Junior Branch in this parish, formed a year ago, has 22 members. At a sale in October \$130 were realized.

In December a box was sent to a clergyman in one of our missions containing a Christmas gift for each member of his family, and a friend added a handsome white stole.

The sum of \$15 has been given to the Bishop Coadjutor for the benefit of country missions.

The Secretary of the Woodstock Branch reports thirty members. During the year a girl's branch has been formed, and the little children have also been banded together with the object of interesting them in the work. Two sales of work have been held, which realized \$164. Much interest is felt by the members in the erection of a hall in the parish for Sunday School and other Church purposes. The building is enclosed, and, it is hoped, will be ready for use in the course of a year.

In the mission of Ludlow and Blissfield the members have been striving to help on the work of the church in the mission. The sum of \$24 has been expended for books for the Sunday Schools at Ludlow and Doaktown. In Lower Ludlow a sale was held of work done during the winter, which realized \$64.22, for the mission room, which is now covered in and the roof about to be shingled. Another little branch, lately organized at New Bandon, a back settlement in the parish of Ludlow, has succeeded in raising \$20 for the purchase of books for the Sunday School at that place. Mrs. Charles Miner acts as Secretary.
