STATEMENT BY LENINE

Says Separate Peace With Ger-
many Not Thought of—Trouble
is the Bolsheviks Ranks is De-
clared Ripening

Petrograd, Nov. 25—Leon Trob-
zky has sent a note to the diplomatic rep-
resentatives of neutral powers in Petro-
grad saying:

"The consummation of an immediate
peace is demanded in all countries, both
belligerent and neutral. The Russian
government counts on the firm support
of workers in all countries in its struggle
for peace."

Statement by Lenin.
Petrograd, Nov. 25—(Midnight)—The
Bolshevik premier, Lenin, replying to
criticism directed against the order that
the soldiers open negotiations for an
armistice, said that the soldiers were

not empowered to sign a treaty for an
armistice, but only to negotiate it.
He declared that Russia did not con-
template a separate peace with Germany;
that the belief that an armistice on the
Russian front would make it possible
for Germany to throw a large force on
the French front was groundless; that the
Russian government before signing a
treaty for an armistice would communi-
cate the allies and make certain
proposals to the imperialistic govern-
ments of France and England, rejection
of which would place them in open
opposition to the wishes of their own
peoples.

There is discussion in the ranks of the
Bolshevik camp, the conflict between the
social revolutionists and the council of
the national commissioners is ripening.
An Army Call.
Petrograd, Nov. 25, via London, Nov.
25—(British Admiralty, per Wireless
Press)—A proclamation, signed "Spiri-
dinov, chairman of the assembly," has
been addressed to all delegates from the
armies at the front and division and
district deputies. It says: "An extra-
ordinary assembly has been opened.
Comrades are requested to come imme-
diately to a conference of the all-Russian
peasant deputies. One should be sent
from each district and each division."

London, Nov. 25—A Reuter despatch
from Petrograd under date of Nov. 22,
says that the allied diplomatic rep-
resentatives had a two hours' conference
at the British embassy on that day and
weighed all the bearings of the Maximalist
armistice order.

Ensign Krylonko, the new commander-
in-chief of the army, asked by an inter-
viewer why the German army had failed
to take advantage of Russia's troubles,
is reported as having replied—"The
German proletariat is hand in hand
with us and will not allow official Ger-
many to hamper the fulfillment of a
great cause."

The military revolutionary committee
has ordered the dissolution of the com-
mittee for the salvation of the country
and revolution, the despatch adds, be-
cause the latter committee urged the em-
ployees of the state bank not to deliver
funds to the Maximalists.

ALLEGED MATTERS IN THE SECRET RUSSIAN PAPERS

London, Nov. 25—The state docu-
ments made public by the Bolshevik
foreign minister Trobzy at Petrograd,
according to the semi-official Petrograd
news agency, show that France claim-
ed that it was entitled to the return of
Alsace-Lorraine, the coal districts of
France and the wooded regions on the
left bank of the Rhine. They were also
to be separated from Germany and freed
from all political and economic depen-
dence upon Germany certain territories
which were to be formed into free
neutral states. These would be occupied
by Russian troops until certain guaran-
tees were fulfilled and peace was con-
cluded.
One document refers to a reported
conference of financiers in Switzerland last

FUEL FROM PAPER.

A woman who has been staying in
Paris tells of a method she has seen of
making fuel from paper soaked and
dried in water. One day she discovered
her thrifty maid rolling soggy balls of
what seemed to her to be dough be-
tween her hands and placing them to
dry in the sun. She said nothing, but
it was another way of getting
around the regulation war bread, but
after several days, when she had at yet
not seen them on the table, she inquired,
and the maid proudly showed her a pile
of these round balls as hard as briq-
uettes, and equally good for fuel.
The maid had saved the waste paper, poured
hot water over it, and when it was soft
and soluble, rolled it firmly in her hands
and dried it, making a good substitute
for the much needed and scarce coal and
wood.

This seems now to be a common
method throughout Paris, as every one
denies the coming winter and a re-
currence of the fuel shortage which they
experienced last season. Some homes
and factories have presses which of
course, make the briquettes firmer and
therefore more lasting and quite like
