

THREE SITES MENTIONED FOR NEW TERMINALS

South of Present Piers, North Rodney Wharf and Nelson Slip Named

BULLOCK PRESSES FOR BREAKWATER WORK

City Council Take No Action After Discussing Ship Federation Letter

The question of a site for the new terminals, which the Shipping Federation suggested should be built in West Saint John in time for next year's trade, was discussed by the city commissioners this morning.

Commissioner Frink said he felt that the people of Saint John did not know what they wanted.

Commissioner Bullock said that so far as he was concerned the city would not do any work on the breakwater unless there was a definite undertaking to proceed with the work of extending the facilities.

Commissioner Wigmore asked if Commissioner Bullock had any estimate of the cost of the work.

Commissioner Frink stated that No. 5, about 475 feet long, had cost \$475,000, whereas Commissioner Wigmore remarked, "then this will cost a million and a quarter."

Commissioner Bullock said that there was another advantage in favor of the ferry to King street, West, and that was that it would give a better opportunity for traffic if there ever was a bridge across the harbor.

Commissioner Wigmore said that at that sight it looked as though the proposition to use North Rodney wharf was a good one but if it interfered with the proposition to extend the Negro Point breakwater it should not be considered for a minute.

Commissioner Frink said he thought that if the government had no intention of proceeding with the development under the tri-partite agreement the land they had been given should be returned to the city.
