### IS ASSIGNING

#### Frederickton Reports H. M. Young's Action After Compensation Case.

An assignment in bankruptcy is being made today, said Friday's Frederickton Gleaner, by ex-Ald. Harold M. Young of Frederickton, who operated a mill at Landers, on the Transcontinental Division of the C. N. R., which was recently seized, together with sawn lumber and equipment, as a result of action by the New Brunswick Workmen's Compensation Act passed at the last session of the Provincial Legislature.

It was said that the partial statement of affairs which is required to be filed with the official receiver, would show liabilities which would reach between \$50,000 and \$60,000, while the assets would not exceed 50 per cent. of that amount. When the mill, plant and lumber at Landers was seized it was said that the claims totalled about \$12,000.

It is understood that there is likely to be considerable legal controversy over the seizure of the mill by the orders of the Compensation Board. Mr. Young said that the mill was owned by his father, John A. Young, M. L. A., but that the board claimed they had a right to seize the plant, notwithstanding its ownership. Included in the assets are one and a quarter million feet of long logs in the stream at the mill and a quantity of sawn lumber.
