GAS KILLS FISH IN LAKE.
Eels, Mulletts and Bass Appear on Sur-

Naples, Aug. 22—(Associated Press)—
Thousands of dead eels, gray mullets,
seabass and other fish have come to
the surface in the past few days on
Lake Lucina, near the north shore of
the Gulf of Naples, from which it is
separated only by a narrow sand-pit.
Fishermen in the vicinity were de-
lightedly, especially as the fish appeared
to be already cooked, but their pleasure
was short-lived, for the authorities
prohibited collection of the fish fearing
that they had been poisoned by an erup-
tion of gases. It was these gases, the
authorities explain, which evidently
coming from the bottom of the lake
made the water bubble and boil, thus
killing, and in a way, cooking the fish.
