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THE ECLIPSE.

How it was seen in California yesterday.

San Francisco, Jan. 2.—At Berkeley City yesterday, the atmosphere was very clear, during the eclipse two stars were plainly visible. At Half-bury the totality was eighty seconds. Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Mercury, and the stars near the sun were visible. The corona appeared with long rays of light parallel to the equator of the sun. Prof. G. E. Hall, succeeded in securing a number of photographs of the corona which show the rays ten or 12 degrees from the sun.

San Francisco, Jan. 2.—At Oakland the totality lasted 110 seconds. Venus and other stars were visible. Three photographs were successfully taken.
