Then came the turn of the cotton teners. Briefly they stated that, in order to retain the cotton teners, the government could not hope, even under the most favorable conditions, to retain the teners at the same price as the mills. They asked for an increase of duty on greys and whites of five per cent, and on colored cottons of three per cent, to keep their mills in operation the year around, and thus render it easier themselves to keep a constant supply of efficient labor.

The evening session was largely devoted to three resolutions, the first of which, which complained that the cheap duty of machine upon which manufacturers did not dare place their own, was a detriment to the mills, was below cost and was ruining the Canadian market. They asked that the duty be increased to the same rate as the duty on class machines. The steam engine industry was represented as being in a similar position, and asked for an increase of duty from 25 to 35 per cent requested.

The tariff of Russian sugar was also discussed, and it was decided that the tariff be arranged so as to give him a chance to sell his wares in Canada, and that the motion made here on Friday afternoon.
