

Residents at a Number of Stations Along a Mexican Railway Were Murdered by a Band of Roving Yaquis.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 27—Col. H. B. Maxson, vice president of the National Irregation Congress and secretary of the Board of Education of Reno, Nev., who has been spending the past few weeks in the State of Sonora, Mexico, arrived here yesterday with a graphic story of a massacre of Mexicans and Americans which occurred at the little town of Lancho on the Cananea Yaqui

Thompson, belittled the matter and said he and his wife would remain at their post. The train bearing Colonel Maxson and party had not left the station for more than an hour when the Yaquis descended upon the little party of Mexicans and Americans and murdered four of them. While the train was at the ruins of the station, the desperadoes appeared in the distance, but did not come within range of the few armed people on the train.
