BENTLEY SHOWS A FACILE REGARD FOR FACTS

Vaunted Honesty Did Not Prevent Him from Making Slight Error of Million Dollars in Estimate of Public Debt.

Fredericton, March 28.—Most of the time of the members of the House was taken up by committee work today. The corporations' committee had a brief session this afternoon considering the bill for the Intercolonial Electric Bill. The municipalities' committee were in session both morning and evening considering the bills from the city of St. John.

Mr. Jones introduced a bill to incorporate the Sussex Studholm and Havelock Railway Company for the purpose of constructing a railway from the village of Havelock to a point on the Intercolonial railway in the Parish of Sussex. The capital stock of the company is to be \$39,000, with power to increase to \$250,000.

Mr. Robinson introduced a bill fixing the valuation of the Maritime Hat and Cap Company of Moncton, at \$1,000 for the term of fifteen years, and relieving them of water charges, in excess of 100 gallons per day.


