HORSES ARE HAVING DIFFICULT GOING

Bare Spots on Streets Make it Hard for Ho. s: Traffic—Commissioner Agar Promises Relief Today.

Owing to recent sudden changes of temperature horse traffic on some of the busiest streets is carried on with great difficulty. Bare spots are numerous and the strain on the horses, particularly with heavy loads, is very evident. The matter was brought to the attention of Commissioner Agar yesterday. The Standard, and he gave the satisfactory assurance that an effort would be made today to overcome the inconvenience either by sprinkling the bare spots from a water cart or by using the hose.

The difficulty which was being experienced, Mr. Agar said, had been brought to his attention and he had been considering the best method to overcome it. The water carts were all down at the Exhibition Building undergoing repairs, but he was hopeful that at least one could be secured to do the necessary sprinkling. Failing that, he thought the hydrants adjacent to the bare ground might be utilized, if the regulations permitted. Mr. Agar added that he would see something definite was done on Friday.

The streets and thoroughfares more immediately affected are Water street, Market Square, the North and South Wharves and other roads in the lower part of the city. The strain on the horses is very severe and if a layer of ice can be laid down it will be generally welcome as affording much better facilities for traffic.

THE FISH MARKET

Owing to the stormy weather during the past week, the fishermen have been laboring under a great disadvantage with the result that those who expect fresh fish for their meals today will be disappointed unless they do their shopping early. Lobsters were also affected by the storm and are very scarce, ranging in price from 15 to 50 cents. The prices on fish today are as follows: Haddock and cod, 6 cents a lb; salmon, 18 to 25 cents a lb; flounders, 18 cents a lb; smelt, 12 cents a lb; bass, weak fish, dore, lake trout, white fish and blue fish, 15 cents a lb; mackerel, 20 cents each; herring, 24 to 30 cents a dozen; shad, 25 to 40 cents a dozen; gaspereau, 7 cents; smoked salmon, 25 cents a lb; kippers and blotters, 24 cents a dozen; finlin haddock, 9 cents a lb; filets, 12 cents a lb; bottarga, 15 cents a box; oysters, 75 cents a qt.; clams, 20 cents a qt.
