WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole need of a family, or any male over 18 years eld, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any possible of the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency, on certain conditions.

Dutice—8ix months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homesteader on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
