Ottawa, Oct. 27—A New York man in a letter to Sir Sam Hughes today declares that the Cavell murder should be avenged by every Briton in the world.

The writer states that though he cannot go to the front he is willing to pay for a substitute and offers to place \$100 per month in the minister's hands for this purpose so long as the war continues.

He asks that the minister make use of the money "in a way that will damage the Hun."

London, Oct. 27—In reply to a question whether the British government intended to notify General Von Bissing, the German governor of Belgium, that he "will be held personally responsible for the quasi-judicial assassination of Miss Cavell."
