untouched. But when the period arrives at the close of the larva life, the difference appears;—those that have escaped the parasites—assuming the pupa state, from which they emerge butterflies. But as for the others, the ichneumon grubs at this period issue forth and spin their little cocoons of bright yellow silk, from which they are to issue as flies. Of the unfortunate caterpillar nothing remains but an empty skin, the butterfly has been secretly consumed.—*Whatley's Fur State Lecture.*
