> An appeal was made to Metro Transit by Dalhousie for the reinstatement of the link. Metro Transit now funds the bus service, however, only on an experimental basis. At least 40 per cent of the cost must be covered by revenue from rider fares. The bus will remain in service as long as there is enough ridership to provide these fares.

> This is good news for the dozens of Dalhousie students who rely on the bus to make it to their classes at other campuses - classes that are necessary for their degrees — and for other students and commuters who take the bus daily.

The bus travels by Dalhousie via Oxford and South Streets, departing for Mount St. Vincent from the corner of Coburg and Oxford hourly from 9:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.
