Mount the bus to Dal

The former Dalhousie to Mount St. Vincent bus route was re-instated on Jan. 6. However, instead of a route linking only the two campuses, the route has been extended to include TUNS and St. Mary's in its run.

The new plan will allow students from one university improved access

to services at another, said Eric McKee, Dalhousie Student Services Vice-President.

"We need to find as many ways to share services as possible."

He cited the Novanet computer system and the sharing of degree requirement courses as other examples of inter-university cooperation.

The shuttle bus service was can-

celled this school year, after Mount St. Vincent announced it could no longer provide the \$30,000 subsidy needed for the service.

An appeal was made to Metro Transit by Dalhousie for the reinstatement of the link. Metro Transit now funds the bus service, however, only on an experimental basis. At least 40 per cent of the cost must be covered by revenue from rider fares. The bus will remain in service as long as there is enough ridership to provide these fares.

This is good news for the dozens of Dalhousie students who rely on the bus to make it to their classes at other campuses — classes that are necessary for their degrees — and for other students and commuters who take the bus daily.

The bus travels by Dalhousie via Oxford and South Streets, departing for Mount St. Vincent from the corner of Coburg and Oxford hourly from 9:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.


