One great trouble of our men in the Howe is failure to trace the record of this man (and of some others around him). He could have been exposed with really frightful effectiveness, if only industry had been applied in the way of research.

I did not like that last statement of Mr. Coldwell's about the recent film production which the Government is putting on. Three or four quotations from the film were all that were needed to convince anyone, and those have already been published. What struck me was that the language of the pronouncement was suspiciously like King's own verbiage.
