THE BAPTIST CHURCH,

Great George Street, is a wooden edifice, and will seat 400 persons. D. McDonald, Pastor. Hours of service, on Sunday, 11 a. m. and 7. p. m. Service every Monday and Thursday, at 7 p. m.

CHURCH OF CHRIST.

Services are held in the Lower Athenæum, corner of Prince and Grafton Streets. Sunday at 10.30 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. Prayer meetings every Wednesday evening, at 8 o'clock.

YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION.

The building, which is situated on the South Side Queen Square, was erected in 1871, and cost \$14,000. It is a brick structure, three stories high, and is well adapted for the purpose for which it was built. The lecture room occupies the whole of the upper story, and is capable of seating 500 persons. The lower floor contains a parlor and reading room, for the use of the association, and two law offices. The basement contains a gymnasium, and rooms used by the keeper. A public meeting is held in the lecture room every Sunday afternoon, at 4 o'clock, and the weekly prayer meeting is held in the parlor, every Thursday and Saturday afternoons, at 4 o'clock. The bible class meets in one of the rooms in the basement, every Friday, at 8 p. m.

EDUCATIONAL.

PRINCE OF WALES COLLEGE.

A two-story building, situated on Weymouth Street. This College succeeded the Central Academy, in 1861. It has been very successful in its career since. The teachers have been men of sterling ability; and the classics and mathematics have been successfully taught. Many young men who have received their education in the Prince of Wales College, have distinguished themselves when they have come into competition with students in the other provinces of the Dominion. The average number of pupils is about 80.

NORMAL SCHOOL,

a two-story structure, situated on Kent Street, near Prince of Wales College. Candidates for teachers in the public schools are educated and trained in this institution. The curriculum embraces all the branches taught in the common and grammar schools.
