

the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. *Appellate* in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court has original jurisdiction (1) in revenue cases, (2) in civil suits when the Crown for the Dominion is plaintiff, (3) controversies between the Dominion and the Provinces, or between two Provinces.

The Judges and officers are the same as in the Supreme Court.
