JULY.—The "Country Gentleman" says, "It will be found far better to keep coarse manure in a heap and under cover till autumn, than to use it as a top dressing for grass land in the spring. Coarse, unfermented barnyard manure, if spread upon grass land in the spring, will be found of little value. The true reason of this is, manure needs to ferment, more or less, before it will be prepared to maintain the growth of plants.... The fine scraping of yards, and even common earth, spread thinly on meadows in the spring, will often be the means of doubling the crop of hay." Unfermented manure will not do this.
