A parcel of moderate-sized Oak and of fair quality has been sold by auction at 2s 1144 per foot, and other parcels have heen sold at a lower rate. Large sized Oak of first quality is always in request ; such logs would bring 3s 6d per foot. A parcel of Elm of fair quality has been sold at 24 4d per foot , bit for small quantities 2s 6d per foot is obtained. As may be quoted at 16d per foot. —There has been a better demand for proved in price; fair specifications have bennahrt. 6to not improve in price; White Oak at 214 to 216 per m. and all pielengths £60 per m.
