To our faithful and well beloved Nathaniel Taylor, John Coffin, senior, and Louis Duniere, Esquires, Justices of the Peace for the District of Quebec, in the Province of Lower Canada, GREETING: Whereas we have power by and with the advice

and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of our faid Province, to make Laws for the Peace, welfare and good Government thereof, and by the statute in that case made and provided, it is ordained that the Members of the faid Legislative Council and Asfembly, do respectively take the Oath in the said statute particularly expressed, as by the said statute reference being thereto had may more fully and at large appear; Now therefore know ye, that having confidence in your integrity, fidelity and ability you and each of you we have affigned, conflituted and appointed and hereby do assign, constitute and appoint our Commissioners and Commissioner. jointly or feverally, to administer the Oath by the said statute required, to every Member of our faid Legislative Council and to every Member of our faid Affembly, defiring to be admitted to take the same, and the Rolls and Records thereof you shall certify and return into our Secretary's office of our faid Province, there to remain, rendering to the Clerk of the faid Legislative Council and to the Clerk of the faid Affembly respectively, certified Copies thereof. To have and to hold the faid power and authority to you and each of you hereby granted, for and during our pleasure. In Testimony whereof we have caused these our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of our faid Province to be hereunto affixed .- Witness our Trusty and well beloved ROBERT SHORE MILNES. Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of our said Province of Lower-Canada, at our Castic of Saint Lewis, in our City of Quebec, the Sixth day of January in the year of our Lord one thouland eight Hundred and one, and in the forty-first year of our Reign.
