was offered, consisting of choruses,

gram of eight choirs of appreciation
of good music were very keen as was
shown by the hearty applause given.
All of the interesting numbers, of
which there were sixteen, were fur-
nished by the choir with the exception
of a very enjoyable reading and an
encore given by Miss Anne Thomson
of Cainsville, whose entertaining elo-
cutionary abilities are well known
throughout the city.

At the conclusion of the program
Mr. Gardner thanked Mr. Thomas
Darwen, the director and organist of
the choir and the other members for
the excellent evening's entertainment
furnished and invited them into one
of the parlors, where a dainty lunch-
on was served by the officials and
an enjoyable social hour spent. Mr.
Strickland president of the choir,
gave a short address, thanking the
officers for the courtesy and hospi-
tality shown them, after which the
party returned to their respective
homes.

Great credit is due Mr. Thomas
Darwen, the organist, under whose
supervision the entertainment was
given, he having spared neither time
nor energy in making it the success
it was, and for the noble motive
shown, that of gladdening the hearts
