

SPLendid EXHIBIT ON VIEW LAST NIGHT OF THE PRODUCTS OF NIGHT SCHOOL WORK AT THE COLLEGIATE

Winter's Work in Woodwork, Drawing, Art, Domestic Science, Etc., Thrown Open to the Public on Occasion of Night School Closing—Program Rendered, and Stirring Address From Lt.-Col. H. Cockshutt.

Better than ever, was the universal verdict of all who attended the exhibition of the work of the night school classes in the Collegiate last evening. Every department of the night school work was represented, and exceptionally attractive and useful articles of all kinds were on view.

The occasion was the closing of the evening classes, and an unusually large number of persons turned out to inspect the work on exhibition, and to hear the excellent program presented.

WOODWORK EXHIBIT
The woodwork exhibit proved nothing short of magnificent, specimens of carpentry of all sorts being on view—foot stools, tables, flower stands, hat racks, writing desks and book cases. Under the supervision of Mr. A. Styles, the class in woodwork has made excellent progress during the past term, as is clearly shown in the articles placed on exhibition.

Equally clever in their way were the woodwork designs and architectural drawings, many of which revealed skill and finesse worthy of professional architects. Mr. Fred Bodley is in charge of this branch of the work, and has every reason to pride himself on the excellent showing made by his pupils' work.

MECHANICAL DRAWING
Somewhat similar to this exhibit was that of the mechanical drawing, there being designs of the most intricate machinery flawlessly executed. The work of this class, under the able direction of Mr. Fred Pelling, was assuredly worthy to rank with any on exhibition, many of the designs being such as any draftsman might envy.

THE ART CLASSES.
The art classes, under Miss Laura Shannon, had on exhibition an exceptionally large assortment of crayon and oil paintings, many of which proved veritable masterpieces. It is obvious that the night classes contain many artists of no mean order.

DOMESTIC SCIENCE
The domestic science exhibition consisted of a tempting array of dainty and enticing edibles of all descriptions, triumphs in the culinary art. The tables containing the exhibit were unusually attractive and dainty in appearance, while the work of Miss McNally, under whose supervision the articles on view were made, cannot be too highly praised.

MILLINERY DISPLAY
For mere man to attempt to describe, praise or criticize the display of millinery and dressmaking, were indeed the height of presumption, but it is understood, upon good authority that last night's exhibition in this line far surpassed all previous ones. The sewing on view was indeed admirable, while the neatly trimmed hats—but description is impossible. Suffice it to say that all credit is due Mrs. Lee, in charge of the millinery work and Misses Carroll, Moss and A. Kerr, under whose supervision the dressmaking is carried on.

COMMERCIAL WORK.
Praise is also due Mr. A. Shultis, who is responsible for the shorthand and typewriting classes, and no less to Mr. Mutter, the genial and efficient principal of the night school, who has every reason in the world to feel proud of the magnificent exhibit made by his pupils. The future of the evening classes is indeed bright.

PROGRAM PRESENTED
An exceptionally pleasing feature of the evening was a program of music and short addresses, to commemorate the closing of the evening classes. Captain W. N. Andrews of the 25th occupied the chair, while on the platform with him were three other officers of that battalion, they being Lt.-Colonel Harry Cockshutt, Captain E. Sweet and Captain Mutter, until now principal of the night school.

Following the singing of "O Canada," came a few remarks by the chairman, who told of the good work being done by the evening classes and of the progress they had made during the past term, paying tribute to the zeal of both pupils and teachers. He extended a hearty welcome to all present, and then called upon Miss Campbell for a vocal solo. This number was well rendered, as was also a violin selection by Mrs. Simpson, both being well received by the audience. Then came one of the features of the evening, an address by Lieut.-Col. Harry Cockshutt.

REPLENISH YOUR BLOOD IN THE SPRING
Just now you are feeling "out of sorts"—not your usual self. Cockshutt, in closing, to have upon the platform with him three such splendid officers of his battalion as Captain Andrews, Mutter and Sweet.

CAPTAIN MUTTER.
Songs by Miss Anghuis and Mr. Humphries followed this address, both being appreciatively received, and Capt. Mutter, as principal of the evening classes, was then called upon for a few words.

Strangers, said Capt. Mutter, could not realize the pains the study, the self-sacrifice which was represented in the exhibits now on view. He appreciated the excellent work done by the classes. Many things had affected the attendance during the past term—the hostile weather, munition working, enlisting. He gave the highest praise to both teachers and pupils of the classes, thanked them for their regular attendance and expressed the hope that next year might find even a larger muster, though all of us might not be present. Many of his former pupils, said Capt. Mutter, whom in the past he had guided in the paths of education, he now hoped to guide to strike a blow for Canada and the Motherland. He appealed to all the women present, whose men were not already in uniform, to send their husbands and sons to the 25th battalion at once. The singing of the National Anthem then brought to a close a memorable evening to all present.

Annual Meeting of the Golf and Country Club

The annual meeting of the Brantford Golf and Country Club was held last evening in the Temple Building. There was a very large and representative attendance. The President, Mr. C. A. Water in Chatham is high, but no damage has been done as yet. Near Jeanette Creek some stock has been drowned, and the high water has forced the farmers from their homes.
