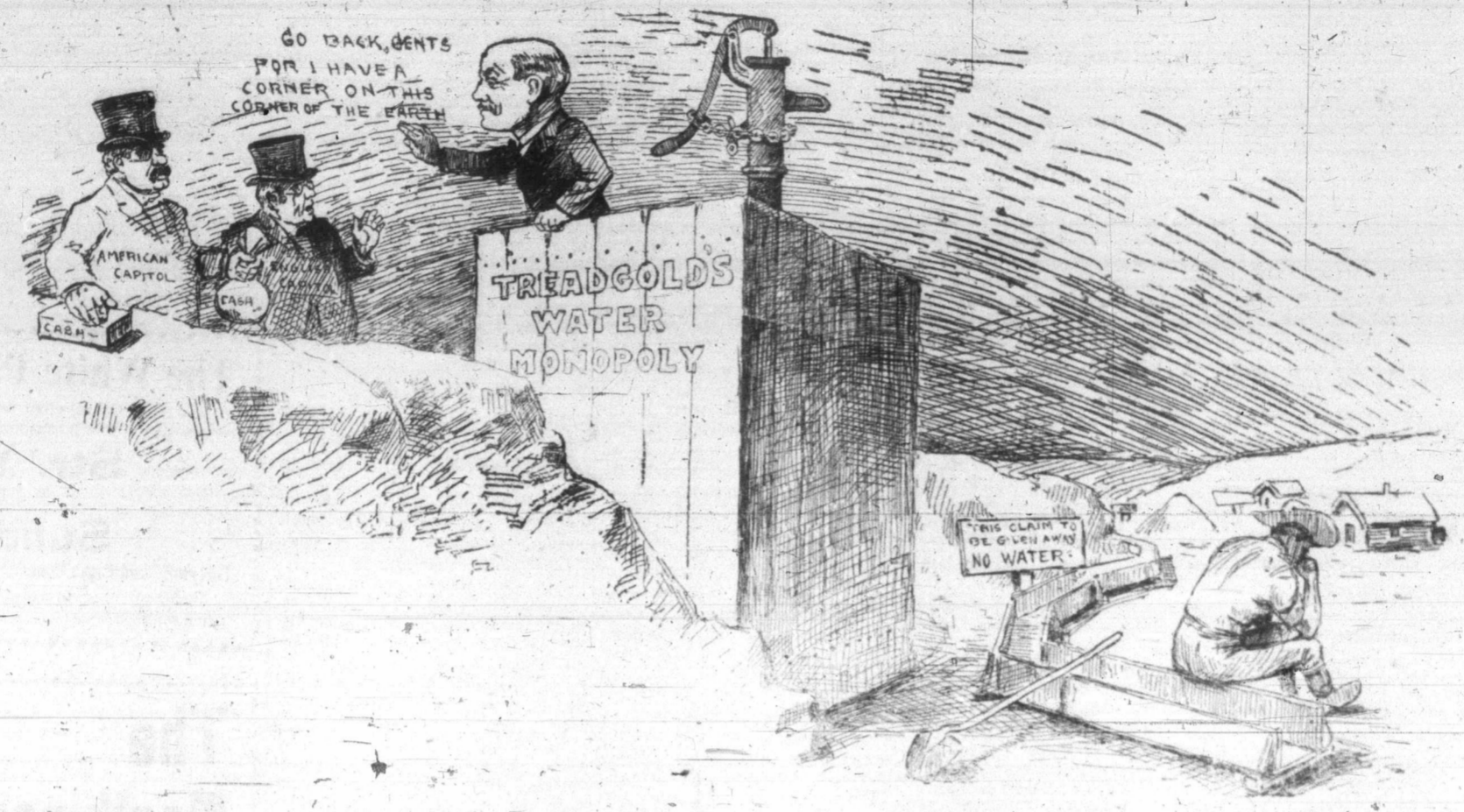

VERY BOLD ROBBERY

Sluice Boxes Relieved of \$6,000

Occurred at Hillside Off 30 Below Bonanza on Tuesday Night.

The sluice box robber is again active and this season he is proving himself to be more daring than ever before.

On Tuesday night the largest and most daring robbery ever made in this territory occurred at the hillside claim off of the right limit of 30 below on Bonanza, when the boxes were relieved of an amount believed to be in the neighborhood of \$6,000.

The thief took exceptionally long chances of being discovered in the very act, as the robbery occurred within 10 feet of the cabin in which three men were sleeping, and at this season of the year when there is no darkness to screen from the public view the chances of being caught are more than doubled.

The claim on which the robbery occurred was formerly owned by Tom McConnell, a brother of "Red" McConnell, but was purchased last fall by a company of which Mr. Geo. L. Taylor is the local representative.

The dump was ground and cleaned up until the work was completed which occupied about 16 days. An examination was made every day and everything was going to the satisfaction of the owners and the gold was seen to be accumulating.

Five men had been employed in the work but they did not sleep on the claim and the only men who were on the claim at night were Mr. Taylor, the local representative of the owners, Mr. McCummins, the hayman, and Capt. Spencer.

On Tuesday night, when the robbery is thought to have occurred, there was a dance at Mrs. McKibbin's, which most of the residents of the surrounding district had attended, leaving the thief an open field.

This is the largest haul ever made by a robber at a single turn in the history of the country and no effort will be spared to bring the bold band man to justice.

Several clues are being followed and it is stated that in a very short time the clutches of the law will be upon the villain.

SERMON ON THE MOUNT

Rev. W. H. Barraclough Will Preach

Midnight Services Sunday Night Where Sun In Act of Setting Rises.

Tomorrow night, June 21st, the shortest night of the year, Rev. W. H. Barraclough will preach a sermon on the summit of the mountain east of the city in the immediate locality of where Captain Jack Crawford, the poet scout planted a flag four or five years ago.

The services will begin at 11 o'clock tomorrow night and will conclude at midnight. The text on which the reverend gentleman will base his discourse will be: "A Nightless Land." A large number of singers and a cornetist will lead the services. The scripture lesson will be from the sermon on the mount. Old and familiar hymns will be sung and the services will be very impressive, doubly so on account of the circumstances and conditions under which they will be held, congregational worship on the summit of a mountain in the land of the midnight sun not being of frequent occurrence. Rev. Barraclough requests that all who possibly can make the trip do so. Owing to the fact that many are averse to going to work tired on Monday morning a large number will make the trip to the summit tonight and observe tomorrow in the sense it is intended to be observed, strictly as a day of rest.

PIERCE FIRES

Steamers Delayed on Upper River by Smoke

Forest fires that have been raging on the upper Yukon for several days are assuming serious proportions and may do an incalculable damage unless a heavy rain should soon occur. This is particularly true in the vicinity of the Hootalinqua and the Thirymile mill river where fog, smoke and mist is so dense that it is a serious impediment to navigation. Last night the Victorian was from 8:30 in the evening to 2:30 this afternoon making the run from Lower Lebarge to Hootalinqua, it at times being almost impossible to see either one of the banks. As far as is known the damage to date is confined to the loss of the standing timber and some wood that had been cut and was ready for use, but if the spread becomes much more extensive it may endanger some of the stations and police posts along the river. The wire being down no very great information is procurable at the telegraph office. At the police headquarters no word has so far been received of any danger that any of the posts may be in.
