Military Service Bill Passes
Third Reading In Senate of
Canada

Ottawa, August 8—The Military Service Bill passed the third reading in the senate today and now awaits only the Commons endorsation of the government amendment, inserted in the upper house making approval of the minister of justice a necessary preliminary to any prosecutions under the act, and the signature of the governor general, before it becomes law.

Ottawa Aug. 4—(Canadian Press)—Sir Robert Borden, the delegation of the D.A.R., Halifax, is the only surviving child. Three children died, Aubrey in Montana. and Harry and Laura died here in Kentville.
