STVINOTOO HOA AHOLOIA V Dordrecht, March 6. - Following vesterday's success, Gen. Brabant again engaged the Boers to-day with advantage, holding the position captured yesterday. There was some smart fighting this morning, the British losing five or six men and capturing the Boer fort, thus vastly improving their position.

The Boers fought tenaciously, con testing every inch of the ground, but ultimately retreated suddenly, carrying off their guns and wagons. A mounted force pursued them, but the result is not yet known. The British isualties during the two days were 30 wounded and 12 or 13 killed. The Boer losses are unknown. Throughout the arduous fighting and severe fatigue the colonials have behaved splen-
