The first census of Russia has now been completed, and shows that the population in European as well as Asiatic Russia amounts altogether to 129,000,000 inhabitants. That is to say, 3,500,000 more than the figures at which the empire has until now been officially rated.

In point of population, therefore, Russia is the most densely populated country in the world, and comes third in rank. China comes next with an estimated total of 400,000,000, while the British Empire comes next with an estimated total of 300,000,000, and most recent census. Russia has a population of 129,000,000; the United States, 77,000,000; and Siberia, 5,700,000. St. Petersburg has a population of 1,267,000 inhabitants; Warsaw, 614,000, and Odessa, 404,000.
