HALIFAX, N.S., Jan. 10.
Russia has ordered two more divisions of troops to the Asiatic frontier. The position is considered serious.

Lord Salisbury has intimated that, should Russia occupy Bulgaria, England will send a fleet to the Black Sea.
Hartington and Salisbury have had a conference on the Local Government Bill. The Liberal Unionists support the measure.

The remains of Emperor Louis Napoleon and the Prince Imperial were removed yesterday from Chislehurst to Farnborough mausoleum, erected by Eugenie.

The British steamer *Voltiger* has been lost in the China Sea. Twenty persons were drowned.

The Canadian Parliament meets on the 23rd of January.
