Influenza Up-to-Date.

New and Unpleasant form of La Grippe in London.

London, Dec. 12.—The recent tempestuous weather and the accompanying erratic performances of the temperature have contributed much to a new form of influenza which is now raging in London.

Nearly every year the old enemy "la grippe" reappears in our midst in some new and more or less unpleasant form. This winter our familiar visitor has come amongst us in a different dress, and there are complaints on every hand of cold in the head accompanied by high temperature, loss of appetite, acute muscular pains (particularly in the shoulders and thighs), giddiness, sickness and nervous prostration. These symptoms are also sometimes accompanied by a rush over the chest and throat and a swelling of the tongue. The sufferer loses all energy and is attacked by sensations of severe melancholy and a sneeze of impending disaster.

All these unpleasant symptoms are nothing more or less than one of the many variants of influenza, and they can be modified and eased by the old remedies if taken in time. A hot soda bath and a warm bed are the best weapons with which to fight the enemy.

Tell of Torture Horrors.

Seoul, Dec. 17.—Harrowing details of their treatment by the police were told by the defendants examined at the resumption of the trial of the 106 Koreans charged with conspiring against Count Terauchi, Japanese Governor General of Korea.

The prisoners have now outlined almost every torture conceivable, and many which are unspeakable and almost incredible. For instance, one prisoner said he had been hung by his hair, which pulled off his scalp. His head now showed no signs of having been injured.

According to the prisoners, the ingenuity of the police in administering torture reached the highest refinement of brutality.

As the close of the prisoners' statements approaches their stories increase in horror. The chief judge tells each prisoner deliberately to relate his story of the tortures and gives to all the widest latitude.

The prisoners assert that the police endeavored especially to obtain the incrimination of foreigners. One man who was educated in America and who returned to Korea in 1908, to-day dwelt on this feature.

Many of the prisoners have named witnesses to prove an alibi. Up to the present nearly all of them have included the names of Dr. Samuel A. Moffet, president of the Theological Seminary at Pyen Yang; the Rev. George S. McCune, head of the Presbyterian Mission School, St. Syen Chun; Dr. A. N. Starbuck, head of the hospital at Syen hun, and Dr. J. Hunter Wells, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, who, they said, could prove their innocence.

Paris, Dec. 16.—President Fallieres to-day received Capt. Ronald Amundsen the Pole explorer and handed to him the insignia of Grand officer of the Legion of Honor.
