Premier Hearst's Government Defeated in Ontario. Cabinet Ministers Lose Seats --- New Loan for Britain.

ONTARIO ELECTIONS.
TORONTO, this a.m.—110 out of 111 constituencies have been heard from, as follows: Conservatives 28, Liberals 28, U.F.O. 41, Labor 11, Soldier 1, Independent Liberal 1, total 110; North Oxford missing.

HEARST'S GOVT. DEFEATED.
TORONTO, Ont., Oct. 20.—The Conservative Government of Sir William Hearst was defeated at the general elections to-day. In regard to the prohibition referendum, it is evident that Toronto, Ottawa and Hamilton, so far as the returns have been compiled have given a mixed verdict, which seems to favor the dispensation of all kinds of liquor under the Government control. London voted dry, while the majority of reports from the country districts piled up a dry vote.

ONTARIO ELECTION RETURNS.
TORONTO, Oct. 20.—The Ministers defeated are Sir William Hearst, Premier, Sir Adam Beck, Hon. W. D. Macpherson, and Hon. J. A. Lucas. The first returns from the city showed they voted strongly against prohibition, but the returns from the country districts and full city returns are not yet tabulated.

ELECTED BY ACCLAMATION.
OTTAWA, Oct. 20.—Announcement that Sir Henry Drayton had been elected by acclamation for Kingston, and that Hon. W. L. McKenzie King, the new Liberal Leader, had been returned, unopposed in Prince, P.E.I., was received with interest by members of Parliament to-night.

Arthur Henderson, M.P., the Labor leader, has withdrawn from the position of adviser to the British delegation to the International Labor conference at Washington, scheduled to open October 25th. This action of Mr. Henderson, who did not leave with the other members of the British delegation, but remained to take his seat in the British parliament, is a consequence of the declaration by secretary Wilson, of the American Department of Labor, that in the event that the Versailles peace treaty was not ratified by October 29th, such qualified delegates as had assembled at Washington must determine their own future course, as America might be represented only unofficially. The strong claims upon his time, due to the uncertainty as to the American situation have decided him to remain in England in order to participate in the debate. Mr. Henderson has cabled to the American Labor representatives expressing regret that he would not be able to meet them in Washington, and saying that he hopes to make an extensive trip through Canada and the United States next year.



PROPOSED BRITISH LOAN.
NEW YORK, Oct. 20.—J. P. Morgan and Co. announced to-day a proposed loan of \$250,000,000 for the British Government, in the form of three and ten year Government securities. The proceeds will be used in part to retire the outstanding bonds of about \$135,000,000 British Government 5½ per cent. notes maturing Nov. 1st. The remainder will be available to the British Government for requirements in this country or for those of British Merchants to whom the Government may send dollar exchange.

A Sailor's Love Letters.

THE LIGHT OF NELSON'S LIFE.
Coincident with the production of the great educational film depicting the life of Nelson is the sale of the love letters of the man who established Britain's supremacy on the seas.
Nelson was really absorbed in two passions—his love for his country and his passionate devotion to Lady Hamilton.

His infatuation and adoration for the "enchanted" may be gathered from this striking passage in one of his earlier letters:
Now, my own dear wife, for such you are in my eyes and in the face of Heaven . . . you know, my dearest Emma, there is nothing in the world that I would not do for us to live together and to have our own dear little child with us. . . I never did love anyone else; I never had a dear pledge of love till you gave me one.

That Nelson, however, was not altogether proud of his worship and passion for Lady Hamilton is evident from his appeal to her to burn his letters.
"I burn all your dear letters," he wrote on March 1st, 1801, "because it is right for your sake, and I wish you would burn all mine—they can do no good, and will do us both harm if any seizure of them, or the dropping even one of them, would fill the mouths of the world sooner than we intend."
Frequently Nelson tortured himself with jealousy.

"I have read your letter, your resolution never to go where the fellow is," began one letter with reference to a royal admirer, "but you must have him at home. Oh, God! but you cannot, I suppose, help it, and you cannot turn him out of your own house. He will stay and sup and sit up till 4 in the morning, and the fewer that stay the better. Oh, God! why do I live?"
The letters, however, show how devoted he was to his daughter. "Kiss and bless our dear Horatia," he wrote.

"I admire dear Horatia's writing. I think her hand will soon be like her dear mother's, and if she is but as clever I shall be content."
I love you beyond any woman in this world, and next our dear Horatia."
What a tragic contrast to the letter which shortly before her death, Lady Hamilton wrote to her daughter, who had ceased to be a comfort to her! It is full of reproaches:
"Horatia, your conduct is so bad, your cruel treatment to me such that I cannot live under these afflictive circumstances; my poor heart is broken. You have helped me on nearer to God, and may God forgive you."

This was in 1815. Twelve months later Lady Hamilton finished her adventurous career at Calais.—TIT-BITS.

The World's Population.
In spite of the fact that the world's population is widely distributed, the actual space occupied is comparatively small.
"Although, says the author of an article in 'John O. London's Weekly,' you could put half a hundred England and Wales in Australia, and yet have plenty of room to walk round them, all the people on that vast continent could be tucked up for the night in Kensington Gardens. Although there is enough land in Canada to make the British Isles more than thirty times, Hyde Park would afford comfortable standing-room for every one of its inhabitants, with space to move their elbows."
"King George's Indian subjects number some 215 millions, or nearly a fifth of the entire world's population; but, although they are scattered over approximately 1,700,000 square miles, they could all be accommodated in a space six miles by four, or less than half the area of London within the four-mile radius from Charing Cross; while a tiny annex less than the Green Park would hold all the people you will find in New Zealand to-day."

"As for the mere handful of people in France, some forty millions of them, Richmond Park would provide elbow-room for the last child of them all; or for the whole population of Italy, with 250 acres to spare."

"If you would bring the entire population of the United Kingdom to London, you would find enough open spaces to provide standing-room for them all without trespassing on private grounds, though they number well over forty-seven millions. Even Bushey Park would accommodate half of them with a little squeezing. And every subject of King George throughout the entire world, a good fourth of the people of the earth, could be collected in the Isle of Wight, so that you might spend a considerable time in looking for them. They would, in fact, cover less than a quarter of its area."

"As for all the people that on earth do dwell," the Isle of Man is large enough to hold every one of them on little more than half its area.—TIT-BITS.
