The remission of the Sales Tax of Freight opens the door for more con provisions. The freight is generally included as an unknown quantty, in the entire bill in C.I.F. shippeurs from the United States and Canada. In order to get his remission of duty on freight the Importer here must first know his freight charge, in order to deduct it from the amount that is dutiable under the Sales Tax.
