

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 18. The question of concessions to foreign companies and the withdrawal of warships from the Straits, closed formally by the Near East Conference vesterday at Lausanne, was settled in a manner not dangerous to national interests and without prejudice to conomical independence of Turkey, the Turkish Government announced to-day, consequently the Government authorized the head of the delegation to sign the peace treaty.


