The Guelph Advertiser has amalgamated with The Guelfh Mercury; the proprietors feeling that one paper could supply the place of both jointly more efficiently than they could separately and prove a gain financially instead of being a loss. How different are the ideas of parties in this county; they think that every little village must have a paper, as if the conducting and running of a jeurnal could be managed by the outlay of a few dollars. The Bruce proprietors are already beginning to see that newspapers are increasing too fast in this county, and that they will ultimately result in a financial failure, a fact which we feel fully borne out by the change of proprietorship. The following is from the Kincardine Review:—"And now Tiverton wants a newspaper. What next? There are already twice as many papers in the county as are to be found in any other county in the Dominion, with the same population, and twice as many as are making a living out of newspapers alone." Port Eigin Free Press.
