Has Quite a Grist to Grind-Drunk, Fast Driving, Robbery, Dis-

orderly, Etc. Albert and John Prosser, two whitehaired boys, are 14 and 11 years of age respectively. Albert was too small to look over the Police Court cage this morning and peeped through the bars. I got Hobbins down and held him until the police came." Mr. Wm. Slater said he heard the cry of "burglars!" and gave chase to the man with the valise (Semple) in the park. He caught him just past the greenhouse. Semple dropped the valise and witness downed him. Hobbins came up and went for Hornley who also tripped his man. Witness and Hornley held both of them on the ground until the patrol came.
