But the couple were buried alive in the hut,
and on Monday the guides left Adelboden
in search for them at great risk of being
captured by avalanches. Several of
rescuers were injured and the party
arrived.

The second search party arranged with
great difficulty to reach the guides, and
willing to face the avalanche, were on
their way to the hut Thursday and
and Mr. Turner and his guide starved.
