

London, Feb. 8. - Hugh Clements, the meteorologist, announced this morning that the tidal positions tomorrow correspond to those which caused the earthquakes in Illinois and New Hampshire, on Feb. 4, 1883.

"Tomorrow the waves will pass through Carinthia and the Jura Mountains. It will also make itself felt near Belfast, Ireland, and will then pass on to Maine and Ontario, quitting on the west coast of the American continent about 10 o'clock in the evening.
