OXFORD COUNTY PIONEER DIES AT HOME IN INGERSOLL

Ingersoll, Aug. 8.—Death yesterday removed one of Oxford county's oldest and best-known residents, in the person of Alfred J. Stevens of Salford.

He passed away at his home in the village, where he had lived for more than 70 years.

He was in his 85th year, and prior to going to Salford lived at Norwich.

He is survived by one son, A. Stevens, also of Salford.

HERRIOT RETURNS TO FRANCE TODAY

Disagreement Among French Delegates Is Feared As Council Is Summoned.

RUHR EVACUATION

Associated Press Despatch.

London, Aug. 8.—Premier Herriot, War Minister General Nollet and Finance Minister Clementel will go to Paris tomorrow afternoon for a cabinet conference and the negotiations of the international conference here will be practically suspended until they return.

Action by the French Cabinet was necessitated by the fact that the question of the evacuation of the Ruhr is the chief obstacle to any negotiation notably the conference, and also because M. Herriot and General Nollet are reported to be in disagreement on this important matter.

The French minister promises to return to the British capital Monday morning, and in the meantime all eyes will be turned toward Paris.

There will be no meeting of the "Big Four" tomorrow, but the two committees will meet. Prime Minister MacDonald will leave either tomorrow night or Sunday morning for Eastbourne, while many of the other delegates are planning excursions preparatory to the resumption of the battle between the French and the German delegates on Monday.

CRISIS IS FEARED.

Paris, Aug. 8.—President Dumergue is coming back to Paris from France's summer "White House" at Rambouillet in order to preside Sunday over a council of the ministers, which up to early this morning had been an entirely unforeseen contingency in connection with the international conference in London.

Premier Herriot in London decided suddenly today to come back to Paris Saturday evening for a conference with his cabinet. He will be accompanied by Minister of War Nollet and Finance Minister Clementel. The fact that the premier arrived at his decision suddenly, after having remained for two weeks in London without taking advantage of opportunities which meantime had made possible his return to resume contact with his colleagues, has caused some speculation in political circles.

The reversal of the prearranged schedule under which the cabinet was to meet in London on Wednesday seemingly has given color to rumors reaching Paris from London of lack of harmony in the French cabinet.

The fact that there has been constant conflict between the war minister and the premier, General Nollet resisting the premier's General Nollet's make concessions with regard to the Dawes plan.

General Nollet has twice resigned from the cabinet, according to reliable information reaching Paris, and special despatches to the Paris newspapers say the return of M. Herriot and M. Clementel to London is due to the fact that Nollet insists upon the maintenance of military occupation of the Ruhr until Germany has furnished conclusive proof of her complete disarmament.

While M. Herriot desires to make concessions on this point.
