To exempt John Watson's box factory from taxation for five years. Carried.

To exempt the McClary Company and fix their assessment and water rate for ten years. Carried.

A letter was read from the company offering to pay 5 cents per 100 cubic feet for water in lieu of their fixed rate of \$200 per year.

The Mayor said the Parolan Laundry was the only firm in the city that got as low a rate as that. The company would either have to provide meters or pay rent for them.

Mr. Wm. Gunn said that several manufacturers were granted water free.

Ald. Carrothers moved that the rate be fixed at 8 cents per 100 cubic feet.

Ald. P. Jones moved the reference of the question to No. 1. The McClary company could buy water in the quantity they required it at 8 cents a now, and their old agreement had two years yet to run.

Ald. Shaw and Stevely moved that the rate be 5 cents, last year.
