DANES DOUBT COOK

Greenland Missionary has gone North to find the Two Eskimos Who Accompanied Cook to the Pole and Send a Full Report.

CONFIDENTIAL, Nov. 6.—Although the Danes continue to profess confidence in Dr. Frederik A. Cook, it is evident that they are growing uneasy, particularly since Dr. Cook's unaccountably recent to Prof. Torpe, a query as to when his observations would be ready for inspection has been received here. It is impossible to obtain an authoritative statement to-night regarding the action of the University of Copenhagen in respect to the proposal of the National Geographic Society in Washington, that a committee from that society be permitted to be present at the official examination of Dr. Cook's records. A leading scientist, however, said: If Dr. Cook's records are unable to control his records he is quite unlikely. A Greenland missionary, the Rev. Hans Olsen, started north last September in search of the two Eskimos who accompanied Dr. Cook. Mr. Olsen has been instructed by the Government to examine carefully those men and to send a full report. If he finds anything suspicious about Dr. Cook's records he will have reason to regret that he ever came to Copenhagen. It is significant that these remarks were made by a man who used to be one of Cook's most fervent supporters.
