# FROM POVERY

Another "Master Mind" Who Acquired \$250,000 in a Few Months.

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—George Pteriostis, who, although he is only 26 years of age, and looks even younger of Justice to have been the "maste mind" in a bill of lading forgery sche me that netted at least \$250,000 in a Star Line pier shortly after the line Adriatic docked late yesterday after noon. Then, to put a bit of gilding on his handiwork, the agents sserted, he would have the consign ent of sugar that existed only paper, insured. After that he would go to one of the banks where were his letters of credit and get the money


