ST. THERESE COLLEGE

ITS TOTAL DESTRUCTION BY FIRE YESTERDAY AFTERNOON.

It breaks out while the Faculty and Boys are at Dinner—Furious Efforts to Suppress the Flames—Loss \$100,000—The College to be rebuilt and the Classes to be reopened.

(Special Dispatch to The Toronto World.)

MONTRÉAL, Oct. 5.—At 12.30 p.m. today, while the students and faculty were at dinner, a fire broke out in the upper floor of the building.

The flames, but in vain. The village engine and hose were inefficient, and the fire spread rapidly.

At 4 o'clock the fire was well under control. The loss is estimated at \$100,000, but in addition an organ valued at \$1800 and a library worth \$10,000 are destroyed.

The loss on the village buildings is estimated at \$3000. There was an insurance of \$41,000 on the college.

Although there were 225 boys and 24 members of the faculty in the dining room when the fire broke out, all escaped without injury or accident of any kind.

The faculty and boys have agreed, but it is proposed to re-open the classes only in buildings within two weeks. The college is to be rebuilt.

GUITEAU'S TRIAL

Me Technicians to be Rained—Guiteau's Encounter with the Grand Jury.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5.—It is understood that Judge Guiteau, of New York, has offered to assist in the defence of Guiteau.

Guiteau's trial is expected to be a sensational one. He says the assassin was glad to see him and that he did not seem to realize his danger.

In reference to the encounter with the grand jury, Guiteau says that he was in the cell, and that he was guarded by a soldier.

The pistol was snatched from him, and he was taken to the hospital. It is stated that Guiteau will show that a stenographer employed by the government, was the assassin.

In this manner it is claimed before the grand jury was obtained, which would under the district law invalidate the whole proceedings.

It is contemplated to take the assassin to the front of the hall, and to take the treasury for transferring bonds, notes and stamps.

A guard will follow the vehicle in case of attack by the mob.
