UPPER SCHOOL RESULTS

Following are the Upper School Examination Results for Watford High School. The standards are as for the Middle School. It is only fair to mention that these pupils, with two exceptions are fourth year pupils and would, not in a larger school, be allowed to attempt any Upper School work. They have therefore their Upper School papers in addition and in this way a good student is able to advance more rapidly. Two of the above have pleted the regular five year course leading to a first class certificate four years. The remainder have practically all completed their Mid School examination in addition to the subjects after their names.

This arrangement, while entailing considerable more work for the staff serves not only to ensure as rapid promotion as possible for the pupils, but also to cut down the attendance and prevents our already over-taxed acadding from becoming worse than it is.

I feel that the above information would enable the Watford Public to judge our results more intelligently. Although even outside of that entirely I feel well satisfied with the results and am sure they will compare
