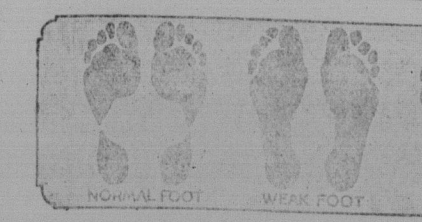
Weather of the most beautiful kind has prevailed for some days back and summer visitors are beginning to arrive in numbers.
