**PROSPECTUS OF THE CANADIAN PRES-
BYTER.**

IT is proposed to publish a Magazine bearing
the above title, which shall be devoted to
the discussion of topics in sacred literature,
and of such questions as are found to affect the
moral and religious welfare of the country,
and the peace and progress of the Presbyterian
Church.

Educated men, connected with the Pres-
byterian Church of Canada, have for a con-
siderable time felt the want of some ade-
quate vehicle of communication with one
another, and with public opinion, on current
matters of importance. It is the aim of the
projectors of the *Canadian Presbyter* to supply
this want.

Although the direct object of the Magazine
will not be to engage in polemical dispute, yet
it will by no means shrink from the vigorous
defence of the faith, sacraments, and govern-
ment of the Church, against any form of error
or delusion by which these may be assailed.
While shunning the narrow pride of which
Sects are sometimes accused, it will hold a de-
cided tone in regard to the Scriptural Consti-
tution and Order of the Church, and endea-
vour to elucidate the beauty and strength
of her Apostolical Institutions.

In the spirit of brotherly love, the *Canadian
Presbyter* will bid "God speed" to all, of what-
ever denomination, who labor in the Lord;
and will encourage Christian alliance and co-
operation in all good works. Favorable con-
sideration will be given to proposals for the
union of Presbyterian Churches. Attention
will be paid to the state of public education,
especially in its bearings on religion and on na-
tional character. Uncom promising opposition
will be offered to the aggrandisement of the
Church of Rome in this Province by public
appropriations or exceptional privileges.

Uncontrolled by Church Courts or Com-
mittees, and exempt from official constraint,
the Magazine will aim, in its original articles,
at the treatment of great practical questions
with entire freedom and independence. Mat-
ters of mere personal difference will have no
place in its pages, but every latitude, within
the province which the Magazine prescribes to
itself, will be given to the expression of sincere
convictions of truth.

Each number will contain a summary of ec-
clesiastical, missionary, and literary intelli-
gence, from all parts of the world. Reviews
of new works will be furnished, more or less
ample, as their subjects and merits may re-
quire.

The Magazine will be under the joint edito-
rial care of two gentlemen in Montreal; and
the assistance of able contributors in Western
and Eastern Canada has been secured. It will
be published on the first day of every month
by Mr JAMES LOVELL, Montreal, and will con-
sist of thirty-two octavo pages, printed in a
clear type, and on good paper. The First
Number will appear on 1st January, 1857.
The terms of Subscription are made as low as
are consistent with the safety of the undertak-
ing:

*Five Shillings, (\$1) per annum, paid in ad-
vance.*

Any person remitting at least six dollars,
with the names of six Subscribers, will be en-
titled to a free copy.

The Editors, while committing this under-
taking to the merciful favor of the Divine Head
of the Church, at the same time invite public
countenance and support, in the persuasion
that a Magazine of the character now project-
ed will fill a gap in the Christian literature of
Canada, and serve the best interests of the
great Presbyterian Family in the land.
