The Honourable the Speaker of the Commons then addressed the Right Honourable the Deputy Governor General, as follows:-

"MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOUR:

"The Commons of Canada have voted supplies required to enable the Government to defray certain expenses of the Public Service.

"In the name of the Commons, I present to Your Honour the following Bill:-

"An Act for granting to His Majesty certain sums of money for the public service of the financial year ending the 31st March, 1940.

"To which Bill I humbly request Your Honour's assent."

After the Clerk had read the title of this Bill.

To this Bill the Royal Assent was pronounced by the Clerk of the Senate in the following words:-

"In His Majesty's name, the Right Honourable the Deputy Governor General thanks His Loyal Subjects, accepts their benevolence, and assents to this Bill. Signature Tourseyer

After which the Right Honourable the Deputy Governor General was pleased to retire.
