*SETTLEMENT OF C.B.C. WAGE DISPUTE

Question No. 364-Mr. Ormiston:

From January 1, 1966, to September 1, 1967, has the government, the Minister of Labour, or any official of the Department of Labour ordered, directed, recommended, suggested or determined that C.B.C. management agree to a particular wage settlement with a specific union at a level higher than that recommended, suggested or determined by the C.B.C.?

Mr. Albert Béchard (Parliamentary Secretary to Secretary of State): I am informed by the C.B.C. as follows: In September 1966 the Department of Labour participated in the deliberations of the National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, with respect to a wage dispute. These deliberations resulted in a settlement mutually acceptable to both parties.
