Mr. Smith: Madam Speaker, I ask that the remaining questions be allowed to stand.

Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich): Madam Speaker, I would like to draw to the attention of the parliamentary secretary some matters arising out of the answers given yesterday at pages 12279 and 12280 of *Hansard* in answer to my question No. 2,317 respecting the RCMP 'E' Division headquarters in Victoria. There are three points I would like to draw to the hon. member's attention.

The first and most important one concerns the answer to the question in the second column of page 12280. There is an asterisk beside it and if one makes reference to the explanation of the asterisk one sees that the cost is only an estimate since "purchase is still under negotiation, which should be completed by the end of June, 1981."

I draw your attention, Mr. Speaker, to the fact that this answer was tendered and appeared in *Hansard* on October 28, 1981. The answer was obviously prepared before June, 1981, and has been sitting somewhere. Perhaps that portion has been awaiting the accumulation of the other information. I would therefore ask the parliamentary secretary if he could update that aspect of the question.

My second point relates to line 6 of the first column of page 12280, where it refers to office equipment and furnishings.

The cost is \$74,100. Then the second column, under (d), relates to the relocation of furnishings and equipment for \$80,000. It seems to me that it is inconsistent to purchase office equipment and furnishings for \$74,100 and pay \$80,000 to move them.

My third point is a small one. It is related to the name "Fairmont, Vancouver", just above the italicized reply in column No. 2. I do not know whether that is Fairmont Street or Fairmont District. I think it should be clarified for the record.

Mr. Smith: I will look into those matters, Madam Speaker, and see if they can be clarified.
