May I take the liberty of quoting from the brief report made to the McCord Museum Committee at the meeting on April 4th, when I explained what the future policy would be:-"In the acquisition of the McCord and in its growth since it was first willed to the University, no single person's work can be compared with that done by Dr. W. D. Lighthall. By his steadfast willingness to help at all times, his unfailing interest in every department of the Museum's work, and by his own personal generosity to the collection, he has acquired a peculiar importance in its development and it would be a very great loss to the McCord if this support were diminished by any plan of reorganization. It is recommended, therefore, that Dr. Lighthall be asked to become a member of the University Museum Committee, where he might continue to keep in touch with the McCord Museum, and where he might share in the Committee's responsibility for the work of the Museums in general and the administration of the McCord in particular."
