THE "Dominion Accountant" has stood the test of criticism better than any other work on Book-keeping that has either been published in Canada or imported into it. As its real merits become more widely known as a text-book for Schools and Colleges, as well as a trusty companion to the actual Accountant, its diffusion will spread more generally, year by year, until it has superseded—as it ought to do—every book of the kind extant; because it is more practical and more easily understood than any other. Its triumphs already have been very great. Many of the best Accountants in the Dominion have received their instructions from it, under the Author, Mr. W. R. ORR, of the Mercantile Academy, Toronto.
