## BILL D<sup>15</sup>.

## An Act for the relief of Francis Walsh.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Francis Walsh, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, merchant, has by his petition alleged that on the tenth day of May, A.D. 1948, at the city of Falkirk, in the county of Stirling, Scotland, he and Irene Isherwood, who 5 was then of the city of Glasgow, in Scotland aforesaid, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is 10 expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

Right to marry again. **1.** The said marriage between Francis Walsh and Irene 15 Isherwood, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

2. The said Francis Walsh may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Irene Isherwood had not been 20 solemnized.
